What is a Parent Compact?

A Parent Compact is an agreement between parents, students and teachers. It explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all students get the individual support they need to reach and exceed their target growth goals.

Criteria to Receive Support

Your child has been selected to receive additional math support based on:

- ♦ NWEA and/or MCA test results
- ◆ Math benchmark assessments
- ◆ Teacher recommendation

The math interventionist will work closely with your child's teacher to provide the support needed. Students will meet in small groups for 25-30 minutes, 2 to 3 days per week. Small group time will focus on three main components:

- 1. Basic math skills that need extra attention.
- Previewing upcoming lessons and concepts that your child will be learning in the regular classroom. The goal with this pre-teaching is to help your child feel more confident and successful when new material is introduced in class.
- 3. Frequent progress monitoring checkpoints that assess student progress toward goals.

The *Bridges Intervention* curriculum *is used* to teach critical numeracy and computation skills at all grade levels during

math intervention time. This curriculum uses a strengths-based

approach that builds on each student's abilities—starting with manipulatives, then moving to two-dimensional representations and mental images. In addition, assessment data is used to provide strategic intervention that aligns with core instruction.
