FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Tonka Coders and Makers Week

Students at Deephaven will be celebrating Tonka Coders and Makers Week during the 6-day cycle from January 12-20. This week gives us a chance to dive deep into the enjoyment of coding, making and STEM. All students will work with HUB maker space materials during a "Novel Engineering" lesson in media class that integrates literacy with STEM. Each grade level will also build and code their own "app" in Scratch jr. to reinforce a cross-curricular topic. All students will have a short lesson on binary numbers and their use in computer hardware and complete a binary coloring sheet to display in the front hallway, as well.

Finally, each grade level will complete a STEM challenge with a HUB material. Kindergarteners will work with Beebots; first graders will examine light and shadows with Keva planks and Magna Tiles; second graders will use Straw Building kits, MakeDo plastic screws, tools, and cardboard to build basic shelters; third graders will program an Ozobot to navigate a maze; fourth graders will each build their own functional video game controller with a Makey Makey and paper circuits, and fifth graders will compare and contrast the ease of programming Edison and Sphero robots to trace a given geometrical shape.

We will track our hours of coding and making to try and reach a goal of 700 total hours as a school. Students can count time at school and at home. Please have your student tell their teacher about any time they code, build, or make at home so it can be added to our school total! Come see a graph of our progress during the week in the hallway near the Health Office!
